# YEAR 11 & 12 UNIREADY PROGRAM

Recognised as a WACE Endorsed Program, UniReady Enabling Program is a senior school university pathway offered at John Tonkin College. UniReady units contribute towards student WACE Achievement.

## What is UniReady?

UniReady is an alternate entry pathway, run by Curtin University. Students complete four units during Years 11 and 12, and upon successful completion of the course, are awarded a notional ATAR of 70 and English competency. These results will provide entry into a number of Curtin's minimum entry courses.

John Tonkin College (JTC) UniReady units will be taught by our teachers at JTC, who work closely with Curtin University to deliver the program.

## How is UniReady different to ATAR?

The traditional ATAR pathway focuses on the academic knowledge required for each specific field of study. However, UniReady students develop transferable study and communication skills needed for University. Core units focus on developing students' skills in terms of reading, writing and communication. Optional units introduce students to the different study areas, and cover both the required academic content as well as developing general study and technical skills.

# What can students study after successful completion of UniReady?

Successful completion of UniReady leads to a range of Curtin Health Sciences, Science and Engineering, Humanities and Business courses.

Please note, UniReady students do not gain direct entry to Construction Management and some Science and Engineering courses. However, once at university, students may apply to enter these courses after successful completion of prerequisite units.

# MINIMUM ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- B grade or higher for Year 10 English
- Attitude, behaviour and Effort (ABE) prerequisite of 'consistently meets deadlines'.

## What do UniReady students study?

The program is designed to develop students' independent learning skills and prepare them for university study. JTC, Year 11 students will study two core compulsory units, and in Year 12, study optional units

Students will select four additional courses from the JTC Year 11 Prospectus.

It is recommended that UniReady students select ATAR Mathematics Applications if they have teacher recommendation.

It is recommended that UniReady students interested in studying 'Introduction to Health Sciences', enrol in ATAR Human Biology.
